

# April 4-7, 2024



### Hosted by Fort Walton Yacht Club Fort Walton Beach, FL

### 1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS).
- 1.2. The notation '[DP]' in a rule means that the penalty for a breach of the rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.
- 1.3. The following Prescriptions of US Sailing shall apply: RRS 25.1, 32.2, 60.3(b), 61.4, 67, 70.5(a), 76.1, 88.2, and Appendix R.

### 2. NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

2.1. Notices to competitors will be posted on the Official Notice Board located on the FWYC back patio.

### 3. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 3.1. Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted within 30 minutes after the Skipper's meeting on Friday and before 0830 on Saturday and Sunday, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.
- 3.2. Oral changes to the sailing instructions may be made on the water in accordance with RRS 90.2(c). Race Committee will display Race Signal L and all boats shall come within hail. Notification of the changes will be given to and acknowledgement received from each boat.

#### 4. SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1. Signals made ashore will be displayed on the yardarm on the FWYC back lawn.
- 4.2. When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with 'not less than 30 minutes' in Race Signals AP.

### 5. SCHEDULE OF RACES

Thursday, April 4 - Pre-event distance race utilizing government or temporary marks.

1000 Regatta Check-In

1100 Skipper's Meeting

1255 First Warning Signal

Friday, April 5 - Eleven (11) races are scheduled with no more than four (4) races per day.

- 0900 Regatta Check-In
- 1000 Skipper's Meeting
- 1155 First Warning Signal

#### Saturday, April 6

1155 Warning Signal

#### Sunday, April 7

- 1055 Warning Signal
- 1400 No warning signal made after this time.

#### 6. THE COURSES

- 6.1. The diagram in Attachment 1 shows the course.
- 6.2. No later than the warning signal, the course will be displayed at the stern of the Race Committee Signal Vessel.
- 6.3. If the change mark is used for the weather mark, the offset will not be used.
- 6.4. If a mark is missing from the gate, all boats will round the remaining mark to port.

#### 7. CLASS FLAGS

- 7.1. The Weta Class flags will be the Warning signal for each Division.
  - 7.1.1. Single-Handed Division Class Flag with One "W" logo.
  - 7.1.2. Double-Handed Division Class Flag with Two "W" logos.



#### 8. MARKS

- 8.1. The windward mark will be an orange tetrahedron.
- 8.2. The offset mark will be an orange inflatable ball.
- 8.3. The leeward marks 2S and 2P will be green tetrahedrons.
- 8.4. The start and finish mark will be an orange inflatable ball.
- 8.5. The change mark will be a yellow tetrahedron.

#### 9. THE START

- 9.1. Races will be started by using RRS 26.
- 9.2. The starting line will be between a staff displaying an ORANGE flag on the Race Committee Signal Vessel at the starboard end and a starting mark at the port end.

- 9.3. Five (5) or more registered Double-Handed Division entries will qualify for a separate start. Otherwise, the Double-Handed Division will start with the Single-Handed Division.
- 9.4. A boat that does not start within five (5) minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.

#### **10. THE FINISH**

10.1. The finishing line is between a staff displaying a BLUE flag on the Race Committee Signal Vessel and the course side of the finishing mark.

#### **11. TIME LIMITS**

- 11.1. The time limit for the first boat to sail the course and finish each race is 60 minutes. If no boat meets the time limit, the race shall be abandoned.
- 11.2. Boats failing to finish within 20 minutes after the first boat in each Division sails the course and finishes, and not subsequently retiring, are penalized, or given redress, will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) without a hearing. Boats scored TLE will receive a score equal to the number of boats that have finished within the Time Limit plus two (2). Such score shall not exceed the number of entries plus two (2) points. This changes RRS 35, A5.1 and A5.2 and A10.

#### **12. HEARING REQUESTS**

- 12.1. A boat intending to protest should notify the Race Committee of its intention and the identity of the protested boat(s) immediately after finishing. This changes RRS 61.
- 12.2. Request for Hearing Forms will be available at the Official Notice Board.
- 12.3. Request for Hearing Forms shall be delivered to the Jury Representative at the Official Notice Board within the protest time limit.
- 12.4. The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the Race Committee Signal Boat has docked and sounds a horn signal following the last race of the day.
- 12.5. Notices will be posted on the Official Notice Board no later than 15 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses.
- 12.6. Hearings will be held in the Commodore's Room in the FWYC Clubhouse.

#### **13. SAFETY REGULATIONS**

- 13.1. [DP] Prior to the first warning signal of each day, each boat shall sail by the stern of the Race Committee Signal Vessel and hail her sail number until acknowledged by the Race Committee by repeating the boat's sail number.
- 13.2. [DP] A boat that retires from a race or leaves the course before racing for the day is completed shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

#### **14. TRASH DISPOSAL**

- 14.1. [DP] Competitors shall not intentionally put trash in the water. The penalty for a breach of this rule may be less than disqualification.
- 14.2. Trash may be placed aboard Race Committee Vessels.
