NOTICE OF RACE

The organizing authorities for this event are the Thistle Class Association ("TCA") and Fort Walton Yacht Club.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta is governed by the rules as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* and the *Thistle Class Rules*.
- 1.2. The US Sailing prescriptions to the Preamble to Part 5, Section B and to RRS 63.1(b) shall not apply.

2. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. Sailing Instructions will be available at https://www.nextsailor.com/app/page/regatta/817 and the FWYC registration desk no later than Saturday 8 March, 2025 at 1700 hrs. To conduct a greener regatta, printed paper copies of the SI's will only be available upon request.

3. RADIO COMMUNICATION

3.1. The RC may transmit via VHF radio information concerning safety, OCS boats, and general information to assist in the management of the event. Except in an emergency, a boat that is racing shall not make or receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats. VHF Channel will be available in the sailing instructions.

4. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1. Skippers must be an Active member of the Thistle Class Association (TCA), boats must have a valid measurement certificate on file with the TCA, and carry class required safety equipment. Skippers may race a borrowed or chartered Thistle as long as the boat is registered with the class.
- 4.2. Eligible boats must register by completing the entry form at https://www.nextsailor.com/app/page/regatta/817 and paying the required fees.

5. FEES

- 5.1. Registration Fee: \$315. After March 1st the registration fee will be \$365. No registration will be accepted after March 7th. Registration fee includes 3 tickets to the Tuesday dinner at FWYC.
- 5.2. Additional Tuesday dinner tickets are \$35 per person.

6. GREEN REGATTA

6.1. This regatta is a Sailors for the Sea "Clean Regatta." All competitors are encouraged to use non-single use water bottles and recycle all appropriate items. Competitors are reminded of rule 47 which states that competitors "shall not intentionally put trash in the water."

7. ADVERTISING

7.1. Boats may be required to display advertising which will be supplied by the Organizing Authority (OA).

A total of 10 races will be attempted. No more than 3 races will be attempted each day. Three races are required to constitute a regatta.

9. MEASUREMENT

9.1. Each boat shall have a valid measurement certificate and be registered with the TCA.

9.2. Boats may be inspected at any time.

10. SUBSTITUTION OF SKIPPERS

10.1. Substitution of skippers amongst the crew registered for the boat is permitted per TCA Bylaws.

- 11.3. Housing: Limited tent camping only in designated areas at FWYC, contact William Zehner for availability (contact information below).

12. THE COURSES

12.1. The courses to be sailed will be windward-leeward or windward-leeward-triangle and will be described in the sailing instructions.

13. PENALTY SYSTEM

13.1. Appendix V is in effect.

14.SCORING

14.1. The series scores for boats will be the total of all their race scores, with no races excluded.

15.SUPPORT BOATS

15.1. Support Boats shall be registered and marked with an OA supplied identifier.

16.DRY SAIL AREA

16.1.Dry sail spaces will be assigned for all competitors and be available beginning Thursday March 6. For arrival before the 6th please contact the Regatta Chairman to make arrangements.

17. RISK STATEMENT

17.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury.

18.INSURANCE

18.1. Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum value of \$100,000 USD. Competing teams must provide proof of insurance at registration on-site.

19.AWARDS

- 19.1.Trophies will be awarded for first through fifth place. Perpetual MWE trophies may also be awarded.
- 19.2. Other awards will be made at the discretion of the Organizing Authority.
